Event Call to Action for Hospitals

- ✓ Determine if there are existing documents, policies, Conditions of Participation, or organizational committees that already exist in your organization that may closely relate, align, or have a similar goal or function for the five health equity domains.
- ✓ Find out who is involved with the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) responsibilities at your hospital. Leverage any partnerships through the completion of your CHNA to address social drivers of health goals for your community with partners and other key collaborators.
- Create a committee to identify ways to address SDOH needs (internally or externally with community organizations).




How State Flex Programs Can Use This Webinar

- Host an event and play the recording for hospitals. After the 45-minute recording concludes, allow hospitals to ask questions to one another about implementation processes and discuss reporting for these measures.
- Is there a hospital in your state who has successfully used their hospital's strategic plan to guide them through the process of meeting the Hospital Commitment to Health Equity measure? Ask them to present during your event to share their process and lessons learned.
- Encourage hospitals to share one thing they believe their hospital does well regarding one or more of the five domains for Hospital Commitment to Health Equity.
- The Hospital Commitment to Health Equity and Social Drivers of Health measures are interrelated with collecting demographic for demographic information and/or social driver of health information (i.e. housing needs, transportation needs, safety at home, etc.). Are there hospitals who have integrated screening for social drivers of health into their hospital admission/discharge process? Encourage them to discuss how this data has been used to help prevent a readmission during discharge planning or follow-up care.
- Encourage each hospital to share one way they struggle in the screening for social drivers of health processes. Other hospitals may have identified strategies to overcome similar challenges.
- Does your state have hospitals who excel in finding resources for patients who screen positive for social drivers of health while others still struggle? Consider using the event as an opportunity for hospitals to engage in mentorship opportunities with one another.
- Utilize the chat waterfall technique! This helps encourage <u>ALL</u> participants to be active in chat and gives Flex coordinators a wealth of information about hospital activities. You can also use the chat waterfall responses to encourage participants to come off mute and share more.
